## Speakers

### **Dr David Bogod, FRCA LLM**

Dr Bogod has been a consultant obstetric anaesthetist at Nottingham City Hospital for 21 years. For around 15 years Dr Bogod has acted as an expert witness in over 600 negligence claims involving anaesthetists, and he has also participated in criminal trials, GMC hearings and external review panels. An increasing interest in legal matters led him to a higher degree in health law and a brief spell as a Deputy Coroner in Wales. Along with colleagues he now runs the popular 'Anaesthesia and the Law' course at the AAGBI where he is Vice-President. Until 2009 he was Editor-in-Chief of Anaesthesia.

### **Professor Peter Hutton, FRCA, FRCP, F.Med.Sci**

Professor Hutton obtained a BSc, PhD and MBChB from the University of Birmingham and is now a Professor of Anaesthesia at the University as well as an Honorary Consultant at the University Hospital Birmingham. He is also currently the Independent Consultant member on the Prescription Medicine Code of practice Authority Appeal Board and is joint clinical lead for unscheduled care for NHS London. He has also previously been the chairman of Queen Elizabeth Hospital Clinical Board, and worked with public bodies including the DoH, GMC, STA and NHS Modernisation board. Former President of the Royal College of Anaesthetists.

### **Dr Charlotte Allan MRCP FRCA EDIC**

Charlotte is a final year SpR in Anaesthetics and Intensive Care in Southampton and has been the trainee rep for the last year.

### **Dr Matt Cross MRCP FRCA**

Matt is a final year Anaesthetic SpR in Southampton with an interest in medical education. He is a faculty member on ALS and SCIF courses and has written a basic sciences book for the FRCA. He is currently in the dissertation phase of an MA in Medical Education at the University of Winchester and is interested in how people learn in today's NHS.
